Details on Classes

Introduction: “Study to shew thyself approved” (Bro. Ted Hodge)

An introduction to Bible Study and some of the key principles that are important before we even get started. We will do an overview of the various types of Bible Study and the range of approaches that can be effective. We will also look at how we can get the most out of the conference, especially the interview sessions where if desired there may be some opportunity to interact with the presenters.

The Parable of the Sower - Luke 8:4-15 (Bro. Darryl Rose)

This class will examine different aspects of this well-known parable through the lens of Luke's gospel. Herein we will see the importance of the implanted Word of God, the principle of God manifestation as seen in the sower, and examine the many obstacles, challenges and opportunities present in the life of a disciple of Christ in developing the fruits of righteousness.

The Exodus: Departure & Deliverance (Bro. Luke Foley)

Centred in the Lord Jesus Christ, the Exodus is a major theme of Scripture displaying before us the mighty hand of God. It witnesses to us how our God is strong to save and presents before us the principles of death and life. Considering this theme enlightens us not only to how God has worked throughout history but also how He continues to work with His people both nationally and individually, teaching us how we must live now if we too desire to enter the promised land.

Aquila and Priscilla (Bro. Jesse Adair)

Within the Bible there are numerous husband and wife pairs. Yet seldom are there such spiritual partners who endeavoured to preach the word, build the ecclesia, and share in the comforting fellowship of the saints, as Aquila and Priscilla did while living in the first century. Their work and love is inspiring and their commitment to the values of the Truth is an example for all those that make up the Bride of Christ.

Serving Christ in the Workplace - Case Study: Strikes and Work Refusal

In this session we will consider what discipleship in the workplace looks like today. We will offer counsel based on scriptural principles that guide our footsteps through some of the humanistic challenges of our age.

The Story of Paul's Letter to the Philippians (Bro. Stephen Macfarlane)

How might a Bible student begin a book study? Together we will uncover the story of Paul's letter to the Philippians and in doing so, demonstrate the value of a book study in comprehending themes that present themselves throughout multiple chapters. As we consider the whole of this prison epistle, the individual verses and principles that are brought forward will begin to take shape as pieces of a larger puzzle. Together we will come to appreciate how we all can be set for the defence of the gospel.'

Set Your Heart on Fire (Bro. Tim Osborn)

Meditation on God's word is a hallmark of faithful men and women in every age, but it is a means to an end and not the end in itself. It is essential to transform the natural mind to that of the divine, developing Christ-like characters that bring glory to our Heavenly Father and edify those around us. Developing good study habits can be a challenge, so this session provides helpful tips and tools for success, including: "the manna principle", creating and maintaining a study schedule, and finding an accountability partner. We'll also share a life-changing way to "set your heart on fire" by immersing yourself in personal Bible study while building godly relationships.

Introduction to Esther! (Bro. Jacob Hodge)

Esther in a snapshot looks like what? What are the overarching types found in the book and time period of the exiles? What is the significance of God emphasizing a type more than once? What does this type mean for us and how should we be changing our lives now so that we are prepared for our Lord's return?
